

Block Credit Decision Matrix

STEP	BEFORE DECIDING IF A BLOCK IS APPROPRIATE ANSWER QUESTIONS IN STEPS 1 TO 3	
1	Is the applicant from an institution with an existing agreement for the course they have studied? If yes, follow the agreement. If no, go to question 2.	Unsure check the register
2	Has the candidate completed a formal qualification or completed Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) level (or equivalent)? If so is it AQF level 5 UG Cert, level 5 Dip, 6, 7 or 8 (nothing below AQF 5 attracts block credit in to an HE course of study)	Unsure? Seek academic advice
3	Identify if the completed formal qualification or completed AQF level (or equivalent) is in a cognate, or non-cognate discipline to the course applied for e.g. hospitality to hospitality = cognate (for more information see Table 3)	Unsure? Seek academic advice

Policy. The list of articulation agreements under these circumstances are approved by the DVC (Learning and Teaching) and reported annually by the Deans to the Academic Board in the Annual Aligned Partnership Report. The Associate Vice President (International Operations) is responsible for maintaining the list of approved articulation agreements.

* Up to a maximum of 18 subject exemptions for completion of a qualification or completed AQF level may be granted if the articulation agreement meets pre-determined criteria as stipulated by the DVC (Learning and Teaching) and the number of exemptions granted do not exceed the credit limits outlined in paragraph 4.7 of the Advanced Standing Policy. The criteria for exemption and the list of articulation agreements under these circumstances are approved by the DVC (Learning and Teaching) and reported annually by the Deans to the Academic Board in the annual Aligned Partnership report. The Associate Vice President (International Operations) is responsible for maintaining the list of approved articulation agreements.

Table 3 – What does the Institution deem as “Cognate” for the purposes of awarding Block Credit?

Specialisation applied for	Previous study at required AQF level, as per testamur, is Cognate if:
Hospitality Tourism Events	Course title contains hospitality, tourism or events as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Business	Course title is generic in business or related discipline, such as Commerce. Business Management will be accepted as cognate, as will any ‘Management’ course within an area of study available at the Institution. However, a course title with Management alone will not be accepted as cognate.
Property	Course title contains Property, or a Property context, such as Property Economics, as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Entrepreneurship	Course title contains Entrepreneurship, as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Marketing	Course title contains Marketing as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Accounting	Course title contains Accounting as either a “Name” or a “Major”. The Cognate course, if Australian, should have CPA or CAA recognition. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Fashion and Global Brand Management	Course title contains Fashion in a Management context, as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Fashion Design or any Fashion Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Sport	Course title contains Sport in a Management context, as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Sport High Performance	Course title contains Sport in a Management context, as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
Management	Course title contains Management as either a “Name” or a “Major”. Minor studies will not be considered cognate.
